Reflection: *Book 4 Chapter 6 On the Question of Proper Preparation before Communion*: "DISCIPLE: I am very fearful, O Lord, and inwardly confused, when I think of Your greatness and my own wretchedness; because if I fail to receive You, I run away from life; and if I receive You unworthily, I incur Your wrath. What, then, must I do, O my God, my helper and consoler in all necessities? 2. Please teach me the right way; inspire me with some short exercise suitable for Holy Communion. For it is necessary for me to know how I ought to prepare my heart to receive You with reverence and devotion for the good of my soul, or to offer so great and divine a sacrifice.

Chapter 7 On the Examination of Our Conscience and on the Firm Purpose of Amendment: "CHRIST: Above all things, the priest of God should come to offer, handle and receive this Sacrament with great humility and reverence of heart, full of faith and the loving intention of giving honor to God. Examine your conscience carefully and, to the best of your ability, cleanse and purify it by sincere contrition and a humble confession, so that you may not be aware of anything to fill you with remorse, or prevent your free approach to God. Be sorry for all your sins in general, and especially regret and have sorrow for your daily offenses. If time permits, tell God—in the secrecy of your heart—all the miseries caused by your unruly passions. 2. Be full of grief and lament that you are still attached to the flesh and the world, so unfortified in your passions; so full of unsuppressed evil desires, so unguarded in your outward senses, so often engaged in useless imaginings; so readily drawn to things outside, so neglectful of those within. Bewail the fact that you are so easily moved to laughter and frivolity, so slow to weep and repent; so inclined to relaxation and bodily comforts, so slothful in austerity and fervor of spirit; so eager for news and to see nice things, so reluctant to welcome humiliation and contempt; so craving for possessions, so stingy in giving and so obstinate in retaining. Grieve that you are so thoughtless in speech, so undisciplined in silence; so unmannerly in habit, so inconsiderate in action; so greedy for food, so deaf to the word of God; so quick to rest, so slow to work; so alert to gossip, so drowsy at holy vigils; so hasty to reach the end, so wandering in attention; so careless in prayer, so lukewarm at Mass, so lacking in fervor at Communion. Deplore the fact that you are so soon distracted, so seldom wholly recollected; so suddenly moved to anger, so ready to take offense at others; so prone to judge, so severe in rebuke; so happy in prosperity, so morose in adversity; so often proposing good resolutions and so rarely fulfilling them. 3. When you have confessed and regretted these and all your faults, being contrite and greatly displeased at your own weakness, firmly resolve to amend your life, and to advance in the life of holiness. Then, with complete abandonment of your will, offer yourself upon the altar of your heart, as an unending sacrifice to the honor of My Name. Give both your soul and your body into My keeping, that you may be found worthy to offer sacrifice to God and to receive the Sacrament of My Body with profit. 4. There is no more worthy oblation, no greater means to wash away sin, than to offer yourself purely and wholly to God, together with the offering of the Body of Christ in Holy Mass and Communion. If people do all they can, and are truly sorry for their sins, as often as they come to Me for grace and forgiveness, I am the Lord God, who says: *Do I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked?... Do I not rather rejoice when they turn from their ways and live?* (Ezek 18:23). I will no longer remember their sins, but all will be forgiven them."
